NECE – Networking European Citizenship Education – a European platform organised by the Federal Agency for Civic Education and seven international partners – is organising a workshop, which shall set the stage for NECE's international conference to be held in Glasgow at the TIC from 24 to 27 October 2019.

Our aim is to discuss basic issues and narratives of citizenship, poverty and deprivation and their impact on citizenship education in schools and in civil society. One central question will be how citizenship education as a profession can learn how to better deal with the effects that inequality and poverty have on the lives of young people and citizens living on the margins.
