The Federal Agency for Civic Education (Bundeszentrale für politische Bildung/bpb) is a public institution that promotes democratic awareness and political participation. Our various activities and publications cover a broad range of current and historical issues in the field of politics, economy, and society. In our daily work we provide timely and sound information and debates via our website and social media services. Our mission is to motivate people and enable them to give critical thought to political and social issues and play an active part in political and social life. Considering Germany's experience with various forms of dictatorship down through its history, the Federal Republic of Germany bears a unique responsibility for firmly anchoring values such as democracy, pluralism and tolerance in the people's minds.

The bpb celebrates its 65th anniversary in 2017 – 65 years of working in civic education aimed at strengthening and improving civil society.
