



Japan has been troubled by an increase of hate speech and hate rallies that primarily target Korean residents.




Hate speech has been an issue not only in these protests, but also on the internet.



Many countries, including Japan, passed hate speech laws.

However it's hard to find the balance between cracking down on hate speech and respecting freedom of speech.



YouTube is one of the platforms where hate speech and disinformation thrive.



The “Ban Festival” campaign was organised by a group of anonymous users called Nan-J.




They collectively reported and helped flag channels that spread disinformation and endorsed hate speech.

The “Ban Festival” was triggered by a post on 5chan, which is an anonymous internet forum.

LET'S REPORT ALL THE HATE VIDEOS ON YOUTUBE AND CRUSH THEM



The movement gathered traction and many internet users joined.



The banning process became more efficient and quickly the “Festival” spread onto other platforms, like X (Twitter).

Since then, Nan-J gained insights on how to report effectively according to different platforms' guidelines.

After each report, YouTube will take the following steps:



Strike 0

You will get a warning from YouTube.



1st Strike

You aren't allowed to upload content for one week.




PENALTY




No upload allowed for 1 week

2nd Strike

You aren't allowed to upload content for two weeks.



PENALTY




No upload allowed for 2 weeks

3rd Strike

You are banned from uploading!

NO!!



The Nan-J community monitors this closely by keeping statistics about the banned content.



Movements like these also raise concerns of censorship.




**PRIVATE COMPANIES CAN DECIDE

Ultimately, whether a channel gets banned or not is up to the platform administrators who analyse reports and review content.

Still, reporting can be a way of working towards a constructive online discourse, and is something every user is able to do.




